We now appear to have the Government's preference.

The Digital Transformation Agency (DTA) has provided guidance on when to use programme or program. <http://guides.service.gov.au/content-guide/terms-phrases/#plain-english-terms>

In summary:

- *Use program — not programme.*
- *Use programme if it is part of a proper noun, for example the title of an existing program or legislation.*
- *New programs should use the 'program' spelling*

Currently from the legislation listing attached there are only three grants programs, where we would use "programme".
